Marc Lorenti is the former Assistant Special Agent in Charge for U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) in New York City, New York. Mr. Lorenti has over 34 years of management, investigatory, security and brand protection experience in both the private and public sectors. During his federal law enforcement career, he was responsible for overseeing transnational criminal and civil investigations involving intellectual property rights, cyber-crimes, money laundering/financial crimes, asset identification, internal conspiracies, child exploitation, and narcotics smuggling and had direct oversight of the High Intensity Financial Crime Area Intelligence Center which was aligned under the HSI led El Dorado Money Laundering Task

Force comprised of 250 members representing 55 agencies.

Following his retirement from federal service in 2012, he served as Director, U.S. Investigations for the Motion Picture Association of America, Inc. (MPAA) until December 2016, directing and managing complex/sensitive worldwide investigations and intelligence collection focused on content protection, fraud, source piracy, money laundering and counterfeiting for the six (6) major U.S. motion picture studios: Walt Disney Studios Motion Pictures; Paramount Pictures Corporation; Sony Pictures Entertainment Inc.; Twentieth Century Fox Film Corporation; Universal City Studios LLC; and Warner Bros. Entertainment Inc.

Earlier in his federal career, he served with the U.S. Customs Service – Office of Investigations, serving in several key management positions as a Supervisory Special Agent, Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force Coordinator for New York and New Jersey, Assistant Special Agent in Charge – Administration and acting Deputy Special Agent in Charge. Prior to joining the U.S. Customs Service, he was a Special Agent with the U.S. Treasury Department – Internal Revenue Service, Criminal Investigation Division for 3 years.

Following graduation from Sacred Heart University, earning a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting, he worked as an Internal Auditor for Georgia-Pacific Corporation in Atlanta, GA.

In 2003, he attended Columbia University Graduate School of Business as part of the U.S. Customs Service Executive Leadership Development Program. In 2003-2004 he was assigned as the Deputy Chief of Staff to the Director – Office of Investigations in Washington, DC.

Mr. Lorenti has been the recipient of numerous Awards and Citations most notably the U.S. Customs Service Commissioners' Annual Award for Law Enforcement Excellence, and in 2015 he was awarded the MPAA Global Employee Award for Outstanding Service – Chairman and Chief Executive Officer Senator Christopher J. Dodd.
